## 2016 Spring Seminar

The spring seminar is a 10-week program designed to supply teachers of social studies with the basic knowledge needed to incorporate East Asia into their courses. Topics have been chosen with the needs of TEKS and AP World History & Comparative Government in mind (Note: this program has no official relationship with the College Board). Teachers in other disciplines (such as literature or art) whose courses can incorporate East Asia are also encouraged to register. Registration is FREE, but required to attend the seminars.

# Your Obligation

The seminar is provided to teachers **FREE** of charge.

- Attend and participate in the scheduled seminars.
- Submit (within one calendar year) a brief written implementation report describing how you have used the material and knowledge provided in the spring seminar to enrich your teaching of East Asia

The lead instructor is Dr. Carrie Liu Currier, Associate Professor of Political Science and Director of Asian Studies at Texas Christian University. In addition, there will be several guest lecturers offering specialized sessions, including: Dr. Kiril Tochkov, Associate Professor of Economics; Dr. Mark Dennis, Associate Professor of Religion, Dr. Peter Worthing, Associate Professor of History, and Dr. Gwen Chen, Assistant Professor of Chinese. Each of the speakers has lived or travelled extensively in Asia and they have authored many books and articles on various aspects of E. Asia.





### East Asia Study Tours

Teachers who participate in NCTA programs may be eligible to apply for the heavily subsidized Study Tours to East Asia by attending at least 30 hours of NCTA seminars and submitting a report on how they have used the knowledge and material from the NCTA seminars into their teaching. Study Tours will be offered on a competitive basis and are subject to the availability of funding.
